What does the communication with your students look like in the digital classroom? What are similarities or differences to face-to-face communication?

Cons

- Writing can lead to misunderstandings and thus take more time. Generally face-to-face communication is more efficient in problem solving
- Missing body language leads to difficulties in evaluating if and how students are following along
- Difficulty to develop a coherent line of argument or thought due to things happening simultaneously
- Additional anonymity in the digital setting may build up a barrier for some
- The digital setting can be obstructive if for example exhibits are to be shown
- Obtaining feedback and engaging students is more difficult
- Actual attendance is hard to assess if the cameras are turned off

<u>Pro</u>

- Possibility of simultaneous student participation in discussions
- Group interaction e.g. using polls, breakout rooms and digital whiteboards
- Communication can happen whenever suitable or necessary
- Digital classrooms provide more possibilities in teaching e.g. 3D models
- Perceived lower barrier empowers more introverted students to also discuss, especially in a foreign language.
